# Notice of Determination of Eligibility for Categorical Exclusion

## **Town of Hinesburg, Vermont**

Wastewater Treatment Facility Upgrade and Expansion and Pump Station Upgrade Project

Vermont/ USEPA ARRA Clean Water Revolving Loan Number: AR1-010

In accordance with section VII of the Department's Environmental Review Procedures for Projects Funded Through the Vermont/ EPA Revolving Loan Program, the Town of Hinesburg, Vermont, has requested that its proposed Wastewater Treatment Facility Upgrade and Expansion and Pump Station Upgrade project be evaluated for eligibility for a Categorical Exclusion from the detailed environmental review that is described in the Procedures and required for projects with significant environmental effects.

The proposed project will renovate and upgrade the existing Charlotte Road wastewater treatment plant, increasing its **design hydraulic** treatment **capacity** by **9.6 percent**, to **274,000** gallons per day. In addition, the project will renovate and upgrade the existing main wastewater pump station, located just west of Vermont Route 116, Main Street, at the north end of Hinesburg village.

Consideration of **Hinesburg**'s request for Categorical Exclusion included a review of the following documents:

Environmental information document titled "Town of Hinesburg, Vermont; Wastewater Treatment Facility Upgrade, Environmental Information Document", and dated September 2008 and revised March 2009, by Forcier Aldrich & Associates, Inc, of Essex Junction, Vermont.

Revised facilities plan titled "Town of Hinesburg, Vermont; Wastewater Treatment Facility Upgrade Study, Addendum No. 1", and dated June 2008, with Executive Summary revised March 30, 2009, all by Forcier Aldrich & Associates, Inc.

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**Facilities plan** titled "Town of Hinesburg, Vermont; Wastewater Treatment Facility Upgrade/Expansion, Preliminary Engineering Report", and dated **January 2007**, by **Forcier Aldrich** & Associates, Inc.

Upon completion of its independent evaluation, the Department has determined that the proposed project meets the criteria for issuance of a Categorical Exclusion. Specifically, the project will not increase the annual average flow (hydraulic) capacity of the existing wastewater treatment facility by more than 20 percent, and it will not increase the organic (equivalent population) capacity by more than 30 percent. The project will not add a new discharge of treated wastewater to surface waters or groundwater, and it will not increase permitted pounds of pollutants discharged to the **La Platte River**. Further, the project does not involve (create) serious local or environmental issues, or meet any of the criteria that would result in denial of an Exclusion.

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## B. Summary of Environmental Review

In accordance with section VII of the Department's Environmental Review Procedures for Projects Funded Through the Vermont/ EPA Revolving Loan Program, the Town of Hinesburg, Vermont, has requested that its proposed Wastewater Treatment Facility Upgrade and Expansion and Pump Station Upgrade project be evaluated for eligibility for a Categorical Exclusion from the detailed environmental review that is described in the Procedures and required for projects with significant environmental effects.

The applicant's request, along with the following planning documents, have been reviewed, and our findings are summarized below:

**Environmental information document** titled "Town of Hinesburg, Vermont; Wastewater Treatment Facility Upgrade, Environmental Information Document", and dated **September 2008** and **revised March 2009**, by **Forcier Aldrich** & Associates, Inc, of Essex Junction, Vermont.

**Revised facilities plan** titled "Town of Hinesburg, Vermont; Wastewater Treatment Facility Upgrade Study, Addendum No. 1", and dated June 2008, with Executive Summary revised March 30, 2009, all by Forcier Aldrich & Associates, Inc.

Facilities plan titled "Town of Hinesburg, Vermont; Wastewater Treatment Facility Upgrade/Expansion, Preliminary Engineering Report", and dated January 2007, by Forcier Aldrich & Associates, Inc.

## 1. <u>Project Description</u>

The Town of **Hinesburg** is located in **Chittenden** County, Vermont. The existing wastewater treatment plant is located off Charlotte Road, west of Hinesburg village. The proposed project includes treatment plant renovation and upgrade elements that will **increase** the **design hydraulic** treatment **capacity** of the plant by **9.6 percent**, to **274,000** gallons per day.

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More specifically, the project includes:

- Replacement and upgrade of the existing treatment lagoon aeration system;
- New earthen divider berm in final lagoon, for more efficient phosphorus removal chemical addition;
- New building for lagoon aeration blowers and for phosphorus removal chemical and disinfection chemical storage and feed equipment;
- Replacement of the existing chlorine contact tank, for more effective disinfection;
- Miscellaneous site and yard piping modifications.

In addition, the project will renovate and upgrade the existing main wastewater pump station, located just west of Vermont Route 116, Main Street, at the north end of Hinesburg village. Pumps will be replaced, a new pump control system and emergency power generator will be provided, and pump station ventilation will be upgraded.

The project will be implemented under a single construction contract. The contract documents will contain standard requirements to limit hours of construction and to control noise, dust and discharges of pollutants during construction.

### 2. Justification for Categorical Exclusion

We have determined that the proposed project meets the criteria for issuance of a Categorical Exclusion.

The project will not increase the **design hydraulic** capacity of the **Hinesburg** wastewater treatment plant by more than 20 percent, and it will not increase the design **organic** treatment capacity (**equivalent population** served) by more than 30 percent.

The project will **not** create a **new discharge** to surface waters or groundwater, and there will be **no increase** of permitted effluent **pollutant loadings** (pounds per day).

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The project is not expected to adversely affect wetlands, wetlands buffer zones, floodplains, historic sites, archeological sites, habitats of threatened or endangered species, or other environmentally or culturally sensitive areas.

The project does not involve (create) serious local or environmental issues, or meet any of the criteria that would result in denial of an Exclusion.
