Notice of Determination of Eligibility for Categorical Exclusion

Brierwood Mobile Home Park, WSID #21241
St. Albans, Vermont
Water System Improvements
DWSRF Loan RF3-257

In accordance with Section VII of the Department's Environmental Review Procedures for projects funded through the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) Program, the Brierwood Mobile Home Park water system located in St. Albans, VT has requested its proposed water improvement project be evaluated for eligibility for a categorical exclusion exempting the project from detailed environmental procedures required for projects having a significant environmental impact.

The proposed project includes connection of a new 8-inch water main to the City of St. Alban's water system and addition of a new vault containing a master water meter and pressure reducing valves. The new water main will run approximately 1,000 linear feet through-out the mobile home park and new service lines will be connected to the new water main. The project also includes the addition of two flushing hydrants at the end of each of the dead-end segments of line and one fire hydrant. The work will be occurring in a pre-disturbed area and primarily within the mobile home park right-of-way.

Our consideration of the request included review of an Environmental Information Document and supporting documentation prepared by Green Mountain Engineering, Inc. dated June 14, 2012. At the completion of this independent evaluation, the Department has determined the project meets the criteria for receiving a categorical exclusion.
