In accordance with Section VII of the Department's Environmental Review Procedures for projects funded through the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) Program, the Alburgh Village Water System, located in Alburgh, VT has requested its proposed water improvement project be evaluated for eligibility for a categorical exclusion exempting the project from detailed environmental procedures required for projects having a significant environmental impact.

Project Description: Replacement of the existing elevated storage tank with a new painted steel elevated storage tank with a storage volume of 300,000-gallons at the existing storage tank site and appurtenant piping, valving, control, and electrical work.

Our consideration of Alburgh's request included reviewing environmental information and documentation completed and submitted by their engineering consultant, DuBois & King, Inc. At the completion of this independent evaluation, the Department has determined the project meets the criteria for receiving a Categorical Exclusion. The project will correct water system deficiencies and does not meet any of the criteria resulting in denial of an Exclusion. Should the proposed work be altered to expand beyond the current scope of work and/or APE, further review will be required due to potential cultural sensitivity of undisturbed areas.
