## Common swim areas in managed Vermont State Parks are monitored for E-coli and Blue Green Algae

Status meanings:

**OPEN** - The area meets criteria suitable for swimming.

**ALERT** - The area is experiencing a category 2 Blue Green Algae Bloom.

**CLOSED** - The area has exceeded the criteria making it unsuitable for swimming.

Categories of Blue Green Algae Bloom:

**Category 1:** Generally safe; little to no cyanobacteria (BGA) present.

**Category 2:** Cyanobacteria (BGA) is present in low to moderate amounts; we use standardized advisory/warning signs in this situation. Children and pets who are most vulnerable to stay out.

**Category 3:** Indicates cyanobacteria (BGA) is present in moderate to high amounts and therefore the beach is closed to swimming until the bloom dissipates and water is confirmed free of toxins.

Vermont State Parks samples for e-coli which is an "indicator" bacteria. It is called an indicator because while it may not cause sickness itself, its presence could reflect the possible presence of other sickness causing organisms.
