Dear Mr. Bartlett:

This letter is to advise you that, subsequent to my appeal of Robert Gorman's stream alteration permit, I have met with the permittee at the site and have resolved to my satisfaction permit concerns that were the basis for my appeal.

I therefore wish to withdraw my appeal at this time.

Mr. Got-man has agreed specifically to (1) anchor the bridge securely to the east shore with 3/4" steel cable to preclude flotation downstream, (2) to anchor the westerly bridge approach ramp securely to the west shore and (3) either remove or secure construction materials presently-in the floodway.

For the protection of downstream riparian owners as well as the applicant, may I suggest that future bridge permit reviews take into consideration flood flows. In this case the approach rampeardeall construction materials would have left the site during a hurricane fringe storm as we often have in the fall. Furthermore applicants should be made aware that they may be in a flood hazard area.
