Dear Mr. Parker:

On July 5, 1989, an inspector was on site to inspect the removal of one underground storage tanks (USTs) for petroleum contamination in the surrounding soil and/or groundwater. Based on his investigation, he determined 25 cubic yards of soil were contaminated with diesel. The contaminated soils were excavated and stockpiled on plastic at your location for passive remediation.

These passive remedial efforts involve both the biodegradation of the soils through bacterial activity, and the slow volatilization of the lighter petroleum fractions.

We believe that the soils at your location will be ready for final disposal in the spring of 1990. We would like to meet with you now to both examine various disposal options, and determine which choice is right for your soils.
