Dear Mr. Dowdell:

Permission is hereby granted by the Agency of Natural Resources, Solid Waste Management Division, to dispose of approximately 100 cubic yards of petroleum contaminated soil at the Palisades Landfill, Inc. in Moretown, Vermont. The waste was generated by William & Nancy Barbour, 955 North Main Street, Barre, Vermont. Tests performed on the soil resulted in concentrations of less than 100 parts per million of petroleum. This meets the criteria for landfill disposal of this soil.

The treatment and disposal procedure is as follows:

1. Store, treat, and dispose of the contaminated soil mentioned above only within the certified landfill area.
2. Ensure that the treatment and disposal site will not impact on surface water due to erosion of debris.
3. Stockpile the contaminated soil in as thin a layer as possible (approximately one or two feet) in an inactive area of the landfill and turn over the stockpile on a weekly basis for four weeks. The material may then be used only as daily cover material.
