Dear Ms. Carroll:

The Vermont Department of Environmental Conservation, Sites Management Section (SMS) has determined that the Former Heaslip Fuels site is now eligible for a Sites Management Activities Complete (SMAC) designation.

This means that the SMS has determined the following:


- The source of the petroleum contamination (the leaking piping from the above ground storage tanks) was removed;
- Groundwater under this site currently or very soon will meet Vermont Groundwater Enforcement Standards;
- The site does not present a current threat to human health or the environment.

Based on these findings, the site has been assigned a Site Management Activities Completed (SMAC) designation. Sites which the Waste Management Division has determined require no further management are classified as SMAC. This designation does not release you from any past or future liability which may arise from any contamination which may be present at the site. It does mean that the SMS is not requiring any additional work be performed at this site in response to the contamination discovered in 1990. If any additional information comes to light in the future, then the SMS may reconsider this determination.
