RE: Soil Pile Screening at Quechee Lakes (VT DEC Site #92-1193)

Dear Mr. Beloin:

On 9 December 1992, I screened stockpiled soils that were removed during a 3 December 1991 underground storage tank removal from the vicinity of the Quechee Lakes maintenance garage. Ten soil samples were collected from the pile with a hand auger and placed into polyethylene bags. I used an HNU Model PI-101 portable photo-ionization detector (PID), calibrated with isobutylene to a benzene reference, to analyze the headspace of each bag for the presence of volatile petroleum compounds. No PID readings were measured above background levels.

As we discussed by telephone today, I am forwarding a copy of this letter to Mr. Matt Germon of the Vermont Department of Environmental Conservation. Please call me if you have any questions or comments on this work.
