Dear Ms. Spaulding:

The Vermont Department of Environmental Conservation, Sites Management Section (SMS) has reviewed the Dufresne-Henry, Inc. letter, dated April 6, 1995, documenting the transport of 1.5 cubic yards of petroleum contaminated soil from the above referenced site to a TSD facility in Providence, Rhode Island. With this documentation, the Flood Brook School has met the requests made in the SMS letter dated August 10, 1993. Based on the current conditions at this site, the SMS has determined that this site is now eligible for a SMAC (Site Management Activity Completed) designation. This means that the SMS has determined the following:

- the 5,000-gallon diesel underground storage tank (UST) has been removed from the ground, and is no longer a continuing source of petroleum contamination at this site;
- all petroleum contaminated soil was removed and transported to Rhode Island for proper treatment; and
- any residual contamination does not pose an unacceptable risk to human health or the environment.

Based on these findings, the SMS has determined that site management activities have been completed. The completion of these activities does not release Flood Brook Union School of any past or future liability which may arise from the petroleum contamination discovered to have originated from the UST at the Flood Brook School site. It does mean that the SMS is not requiring any additional work be performed in response to the contamination discovered at this site.
