RE: Site Management Activity Completed, Vermont Castings, Randolph, VT (Site #94-1715)

Dear Mr. Smith:

The Vermont Department of Environmental Conservation, Sites Management Section (SMS) has reviewed the Wagner, Heindel, & Noyes, Inc. letter report dated August 29, 1995 for the above referenced site. Enclosed with this letter was documentation confirming the destruction of the 39.75 tons of diesel fuel contaminated soil. This soil was removed from the ground on July 19, 1995. Based on the current conditions at this site, the SMS has determined that this site is now eligible for a SMAC (Site Management Activity Completed) designation. This means that the SMS has determined the following:

- the 10,000-gallon diesel UST has been removed from the ground, and there is no longer a known potential source of petroleum contamination present at this site;
all petroleum contaminated soil was removed on July 19, 1995, and has been thermally treated and recycled at Environmental Soil Management, Inc. in New Hampshire;
groundwater at this site was not encountered during the UST removal, and since all petroleum contaminated soil was removed and the groundwater is located at a depth of greater than 30 feet below ground surface, the SMS believes that groundwater was not impacted by this release; and
the residual contamination does not pose an unacceptable risk to human health or the environment.

Based on these findings, the SMS has determined that site management activities have been completed. The completion of these activities does not release Vermont Castings, Inc. of any past or future liability which may arise from the petroleum contamination which was discovered to have originated from the diesel underground storage tank at the Vermont Castings-Randolph site. It does mean that the SMS is not requiring any additional work be performed in response to the contamination which was discovered in at this site.
