Dear Mr. Martin:

The Vermont Department of Environmental Conservation, Sites Management Section (SMS) has completed its review of information provided to us concerning petroleum contamination at the CV Landfill property. Based on this information, the SMS can make the following determination:

- On March 29, 1995 a 2,000 gallon underground storage tank (UST) containing diesel fuel was removed from CV Landfill garage location. During the removal diesel contamination was measured in soils in the vicinity of the UST.
- During the UST removal 24 cubic yards of soil was removed from the ground and stockpiled on site for treatment. The limits of the contamination were defined by the excavation. No additional subsurface investigation was recommended by the consultant, Dufresne-Henry, Inc.
- On June 16, 2004, K-D Associates was on-site to sample the soil stockpile. KD Associates discovered that a portion of the original stockpile was spread on site in an area occupied by the Household Hazardous Waste storage area. 10 yards of soil remained stockpiled. KD Associates tested the stockpile. No visual, olfactory or PID readings were detected in the stockpile.
- The SMS has concluded that there is no significant threat to human health or the environment resulting from any residual petroleum contamination which may be present at this property.

Based on the above, the SMS is assigning this site a Site Management Activity Completed (SMAC) designation. This SMAC designation does not release CV Landfill from any past or future liability associated with any contamination remaining at the site. It does, however, mean that the SMS is not requesting any additional work at this time. If you have any questions or comments, please feel free to contact me at (802)-241-3888.
