Dear Mr. Sailer:

The Sites Management Section (SMS) has reviewed the September 30, 1998 confirmation that the 7 yards petroleum contaminated have been disposed of at the Waste USA landfill in Coventry, VT. The SMS has also reviewed information contained in the site file.

With this information, the SMS can now make the following conclusions:

- On October 18, 1995 one 10,000 gallon diesel underground storage tank (UST) and a 1,000 gallon gasoline UST were removed from the Sailer Construction facility in Plymouth, VT:
- A limited amount of petroleum contamination to the soils was measured during the time of the removal of the USTs. The contaminated soils were removed from the ground and stockpiled on site for treatment. No additional subsurface work was deemed necessary following the soil removal.
- The contaminated soils were disposed of at the Waste USA landfill on September 29, 1998.
- No unacceptable risk to human health and the environment is present due to any residual contamination remaining in the ground from the former USTs at your property.

Based on the above, the SMS is assigning this site a Site Management Activity Completed (SMAC) designation. This SMAC designation does not release you of any past or future liability associated with the petroleum contamination onsite. It does, however, mean that the SMS is not requesting any additional work in response to the UST removals in 1995.
