RE: Site Management Activity Completed (SMAC) designation for the Roxbury Fish Culture Station in Roxbury (Site #97-2217)

Dear Mr. Wiggins:

The Sites Management Section (SMS) has reviewed the "Initial Investigation of Suspected Subsurface Petroleum Contamination" dated June 1998 by Griffin International, Inc. for the above referenced site. Based on the information in the report, the SMS has determined the site to be eligible for a Site Management Activity Completed (SMAC) designation.

This determination was based on the following:


- The likely source of contamination were the three underground storage tanks (USTs) which were removed on June 25, 1997.
- Groundwater did not contain evidence of petroleum contaminants, as evidenced by the groundwater analytical results from the four onsite monitoring wells which contained non-detect levels of petroleum contaminants.
- The onsite supply well was sampled and did not contain evidence of petroleum compounds.
- Little to no risk is posed by any residual subsurface contamination to any sensitive receptors in the area which may remain at the site.

Based on the results of the investigation, the site has been assigned a Site Management Activity Completed (SMAC) designation. Sites which the Waste Management Division have determined require no further management are given a SMAC designation. The designation does not release the Vermont Fish and Wildlife Department from any past or future liability which may arise from the petroleum contamination which originated from the underground storage tanks at the Roxbury Fish Culture Station. The SMAC designation

does mean that the SMS isn't requiring any additional work be performed at this site in response to the initial contamination.
