Dear Mr. Moirano:

The Vermont Department of Environmental Conservation, Sites Management Section (SMS) has received and reviewed the June 19, 2006 Aquaterra Well Maintenance Plan concerning the above referenced site. Based on a review of the file, the current conditions at this site and SMS procedures, the SMS has determined that this site meets the Waste Management Division's Sites Management Activities Complete (SMAC) policy.

This means that the SMS has determined the following:


- the source of the potential contamination at this site has been adequately characterized and the underground storage tanks at the site have been removed;
- groundwater under the site does not exceed Vermont Groundwater Enforcement Standards in all monitoring wells;
- the remaining monitoring wells on the site will be maintained by the L. E. Farrell/Pepsi Bottling Company, Inc. at your costs until they are not needed in accordance with the Aquaterra June 19, 2006 plan. Once these wells are no longer needed, they will be properly closed at your expense;
- the site does not pose an unreasonable risk to human health or the environment.



Based on these findings, the site has been assigned a Site Management Activities Completed (SMAC) designation. Sites which the Waste Management Division has determined require no further management are classified as SMAC. This designation does not release the L. E. Farrell Company, Inc. from any past or future liability that may arise from the petroleum contamination that originated from the underground storage tank system at this site. It does mean that the SMS is not requiring any additional work be performed at this site in response to the contamination discovered in 1998. If any additional information comes to light in the future, then the SMS may reconsider this determination.
