Dear Mr. and Mrs. Skiff:

The Vermont Department of Environmental Conservation, Sites Management Section (SMS) has reviewed the information provided by Twin State Environmental dated May 5, 2000. The SMS has also reviewed the information contained in the site file.

With this information, the SMS can make the following determination that:

- An underground Fuel Oil storage tank (UST) and its associated piping were removed from the site on May, 1999. Contaminated soils were observed during this work.
- On November 11, 1999 Twin State Environmental supervised the completion of five soil borings placed around the former UST area. Two confirmatory soil samples were collected and analyzed by a laboratory. Confirmatory soil samples indicated that soils at sampling points SB-2 and SB-4 had no BTEX concentrations above the Region III RBCs and that TPH concentrations remained below the Vermont guidance value.
- No receptors were identified which could be at risk from any residual contamination which may exist on your property.
- There is no proof of significant threat to human health or the environment resulting from this release.

Based on the above, SMS concurs with Twin State Environmental's recommendation and is assigning this site a Site Management Activity Completed (SMAC) designation. This SMAC designation does not release you of any past or future liability associated with the petroleum contamination remaining at the site. It does, however, mean that the SMS is not requesting any additional work at this time. If you have any questions or comments, please feel free to contact me at (802)-241-3888.
