Hi Alyssa,

Senate Institutions is looking for DEC testimony from you on PFOA needs in the capital adjustment bill. The requested date is Tuesday, April 12th. Do you want me to request a date later in the week for you? Or find someone else to testify?

Here are some possible topics for testimony :

1. DEC is asking the Appropriations Committee to strike the population cap of 10,000 people for the drinking water planning fund, which arguably could go in the capital adjustment bill if Appropriations determines it doesn't have jurisdiction.
2. DEC could ask for capital adjustment funding of ECF on superfund sites (especially Elizabeth Mine) so that we'll have money in the ECF fund for PFOA response.
3. DEC could urge committee to pass out H610 because that will simplify access to all DEC loan funds.
